Have you ever heard of Bhutan? It's a small country lying between China and India. It's very high in the mountains. But people living there grow a lot of fruit, vegetables and rice.

People in Bhutan say, "Forty years ago, our harvests were much smaller. But a man from Japan changed our way of farming."

The man's name was Nishioka Keiji.

In 1964, Nishioka went to Bhutan. At first he wanted to teach the Bhutanese a new way to grow rice. But most of them were not interested.

So Nishioka decided to grow vegetables. He planted seeds brought from Japan. Many of the vegetables grew well. People were surprised and wanted to grow them, too. Nishioka learned the language spoken there and taught the people how to grow those vegetables. The next year, they had a good harvest. People began to trust him.
